

This message contains the guidance for recording LAHSO programs in PTRS using the "Tracking" field. This allows the SPM to take credit for the runway incursion program (with an "R" in the National Use field -- AND -- concurrently take credit for a LAHSO program.

I find it appropriate for the SPMs to go back and amend any and all FY-99 PTRS records with the desired coding if they have records of previous meeting which included runway incursion and/or LAHSO topics and did not record it in the safety meeting PTRS record.

FSIB number FSGA 99-02, titled "General Aviation 14 CFR Parts 91 and 125 Land and Hold Short Operations (LAHSO) contains the guidances on LAHSO.

Per paragraph 3(B) of the bulletin, the Aviation Safety Program and SPMs have been tasked to immediately initiate an educational program for general aviation pilots. Paragraph 3(B) reads, in pertinent part,:

### 3. ACTION

B. Using the Seminar in a Box titled, "Operations at Towered Airports," and the information contained in the appendices of this bulletin, each Safety Program Manager (Operations) will develop and add a LAHSO segment into their schedule of safety education seminars within 30 days of the effective date of this bulletin and thereafter for the next 180 days, when and where appropriate. After 180 days, LAHSO will be a topic of emphasis at least quarterly, until otherwise directed by the National Resource Specialist for Aviation Safety Programs.

For national tracking purposes, using activity numbers x931 and x932, enter "LAHSO" in the "Tracking" field of the PTRS record for each safety program conducted which includes a LAHSO presentation meeting the requirements of this bulletin. This tracking requirement is applicable through the end of FY-99 (September 30, 1999), which corresponds to the initial 180 day emphasis period. Safer Skies agenda topic codes can concurrently be entered in the "National Use" field, as appropriate to the safety program conducted.

The LAHSO meetings should continue to be tracked beyond the September 30th cut off date. Continue to use the above guidance to track LAHSO until further notice.
